# Data, the (not so very) new paradigm

- “Just as oil was likened to black gold, data takes on a new importance and value in the digital age.” ([Neelie Kroes](#), vice-president of the European Commission responsible for the Digital Agenda, [2011](#))
- Data is the new gold — we need to use and reuse it, we need tools, e-infrastructures, and skills to treat it.

# The EOSC context

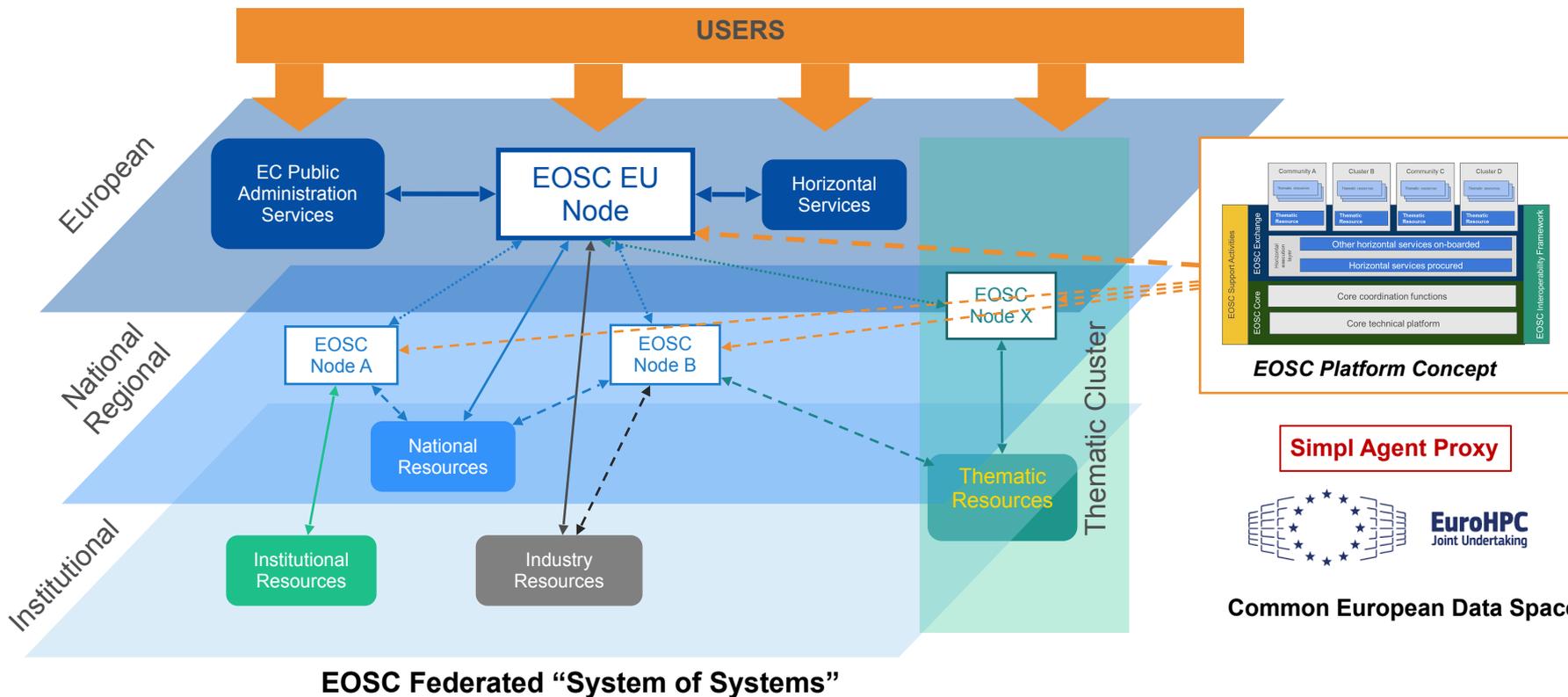


- EOSC is a vision: FAIR\* data, complete data lifecycle
- Starts with the FAIRisation of data (training, DMPs, competence centres, etc.)
- Trusted repositories - interoperable!
- Shared services - from transverse (AAI\*\*, monitoring, service management, etc.) to domain-specific
- Access to e-infrastructures
- Above all: sharing expertise, strengthening skills
- **But:** Lack of expertise in Open Science and FAIR research outputs management among EOSC stakeholders. Absence of clear definition of data professional profiles and career paths for these roles. Fragmentation of training resources.
- (Part of the) Solution: **Competence Centres**

\* FAIR : Findable, Accessible, Interoperable, Reusable

\*\* AAI : Authentication and Authorisation Infrastructure

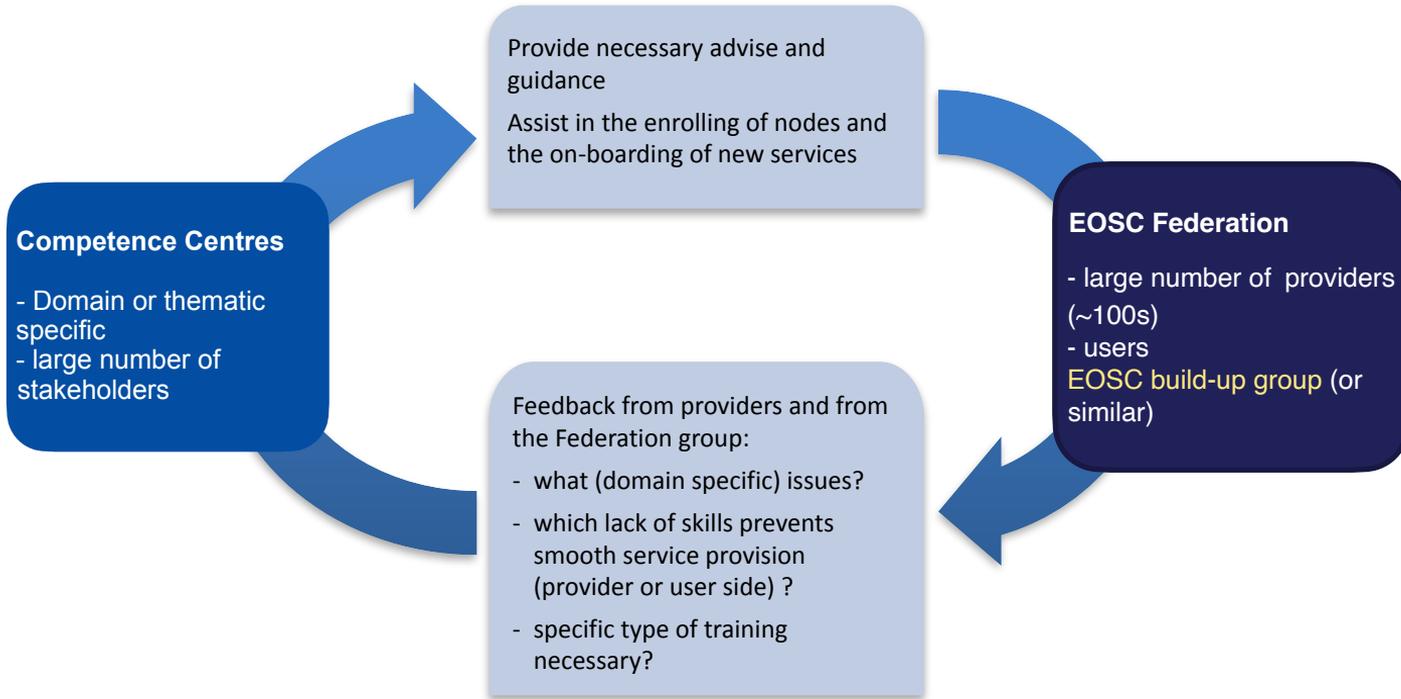

# Competences in the EOSC Federation

- Although based on various skills, the EOSC-Federation is a **technical ecosystem** to allow launching work flows involving data, services, e-infrastructures
- How to ensure that
  - necessary skills are accessible for users and providers
  - competence centres learn from the development and requirements in the EOSC Federation
- This goes far beyond a help-desk approach

# Competence centres in the EOSC ecosystem

- Competence centres are not part of the EOSC Federation, but closely linked to it
- Provide guidance and advise in enrolling of nodes and on-boarding of services
- Receive feedback on missing elements, training needs, apparent discrepancies between domains, etc.
- Main contact point : [EOSC build-up group](#) (or successor), i.e. body representing the EOSC nodes, EU node, and key stakeholders of the federation
- Ensure visibility of competence centres for EOSC Federation users
- Support through national programmes or HORIZON-INFRA or specific EOSC (co-fund) actions (needs to be seen in the [FP10](#) discussion context)
